James Scott Skinner was a renowned violinist and composer, and a bright star in Scottish fiddle musical history. He was born in Aberdeenshire, Scotland, in 1843, and died in Aberdeen in 1927. During his life, he performed widely in Scotland, the United States, and Canada. He was one of the first recording artists in Scotland—he made his first recording in Glasgow, in 1899, and continued recording until 1922.
